ST. ROBERT SCHOOL PARENT INVOLVEMENT PROGRAM

- Purpose The purpose of the PIP program is to encourage parent involvement in the variety of activities and events offered throughout the school year. Time and talent of every family is needed to support the school.
- **Options** 1. Each family <u>MUST</u> complete the required credits of school service per school year (March to March).
 - a. Young Fives, Kindergarten and families new to St. Robert School must complete a minimum of 7 credits.
 - b. Families with students in grades 1-8 must complete a minimum of 15 credits.
 - If a family is unable or unwilling to complete their credits of service to the school, they will be assessed a fee <u>at the time of registration</u> for the upcoming school year.
 - a. \$140.00 (7 credit families)
 - b. \$300.00 (15 credit families)
 - 3. Families that do not reach their credit minimum requirement by March 31st of the current school year will be charged \$20 per missing service credit.

Procedures

- Each individual must fill out a PIP Service Credit Sheet. The sheets are available online at <u>www.strobertschool.com</u> (under the "Parents/Community" tab) or in the pamphlet rack in the school office. The event name, date and number of hours spent on the project must be included.
- PIP Service Credit Sheets must be turned into the school office. The form must be filled out completely to receive credit. Parents are responsible for filling out and turning in their own PIP Service Credit Sheets (this includes documenting Superdraw ticket sales/activities).
- 3. Parents will receive statements updating PIP progress with 1st, 2nd and 3rd quarter report cards.
- 4. A final statement will be sent home the week after March 31st. Families will have a two week grace period in April for turning in undocumented PIP activities.
- 5. Families who do not have the required number of credits at the end of the grace period will be billed for the missing credits.
